

Readers can access abstracts and full text of these advance articles, which feature the latest and most relevant peer-reviewed research, by selecting *The Journal of Clinical Psychiatry* at PSYCHIATRIST.COM. Ahead-of-print abstracts will also be available through PubMed/MEDLINE at the National Library of Medicine. The bibliographic records at NLM will be updated to include the volume, issue, and page numbers of the print publication in which the articles appear. This important initiative allows our editors to reduce the time from submission to publication and speed the release of important information in citable form to our readers.

The online-ahead-of-print feature is a prime example of how adept we have become in bridging the gap between print and the Web. Other examples include embedding video into posted Supplements and developing PubWeb, which combines information in *The Journal of Clinical Psychiatry* with an online CME activity.
